Identify the author and the title/source and write pointed comments on the meaning and importance of **EACH** of the following quotations:

1. "So saying, her rash hand in evil hour,

Forth reaching to the fruit, she plucked, she eat.

Earth felt the wound, and Nature from her seat

Sighing through all her works gave signs of woe,

That all was lost....

In fruit she never tasted, whether true

Or fancied so, through expectation high

Of knowledge; nor was godhead from her thought.

Greedily she engorged without constraint,

And knew not eating death: satiate at length...."

2. "Experience, though all authority

Was lacking in the world, confers on me

The right to speak of marriage, and unfold

Its woes. For, lords, since I was twelve years old

-- Thanks to eternal God in heaven alive—

I've married at church door no less than five

Husbands, provided that I can have been

So often wed, and all were worthy men."

3. "We are left with the man whose place is between these two extremes. Such is the man who on the one hand is not pre-eminent in virtue and justice, and yet on the other hand does not fall into misfortune through vice or depravity, but falls because of some mistake;..."

- 4. "Midway along the journey of our life
 - I woke to find myself in a dark wood,

For I had wandered off from the straight path.

How hard it is to tell what it was like.

This wood of wilderness, savage and stubborn

(the thought of it brings back all my old fears),

A bitter place! Death could scarce be bitterer."

5. "Women, my task is fixed: as quickly as I may
